APPROVAL OF THE 2021 / 2022 BID LEVY.

Under the 2016 BID Policy, annual BID levies are always set a full calendar year in advance. Therefore, approval of the 2021 / 2022 BID Levy total is sought at this AGM.

MOTION: The 2021 / 2022 BID levy of \$261,216 (an increase of \$10,047) be approved.

Explanation: 2021 levy + 4% = **\$251,169** (+ subsequent 10% AC36 specific increase of \$25,776 = \$276,945).

GENERAL BUSINESS

Anna McGovern (More FM Rodney) commented that in 20 years of living and working in Orewa she has never seen the town as vibrant as it is now. All credit given to the DOB team.

Steve McClean (New World Orewa) enquired re any perceived 'risks' to Orewa moving forward

Hellen responded regarding potential difficulties for businesses now the wage subsidy has ended, the Government Interest Free Loan Scheme and the Regional Funding Grants scheme have expired. This may present a delayed 'financial crisis' for some businesses. Hellen and Gayle will keep abreast of businesses suffering over the next few months.

AND

The new large format Briscoes & Rebel Sport stores in Silverdale – will they or won't they pull business from Orewa retailers? As they are focussed on product lines not widely sold in Orewa the impact may be minimal but Hellen & Gayle will stay in touch with stores such as Underground Skate, Island (homeware line), Pharmacy (Gift lines) to monitor impacts.

Sandy Urwin commented that these stores could be a positive as they may reduce the retail seepage to Albany.

Barbara Everiss commented that Waiwera needs to back up and running to bring increased spend to Orewa.

Janet Fitzgerald updated that the property has been sold and there is a 10-year plan in place to fully redevelop this resort – accommodation, health spa etc.

Janet also advised that Microsoft (and possibly Amazon) are building new Head Office premises in the Silverdale Business Park. *Housing / employment / spend would all significantly increase*

Sandy Urwin commented re the tree works taking place around the Estuary walkway, but the tree debris is not being cleaned up. Hellen will investigate this.
